



Link to your OPAC and other services with Scopus

Scopus empowers administrators to set up the configuration of their institute’s linking options to ensure full access to entitlements their users need.

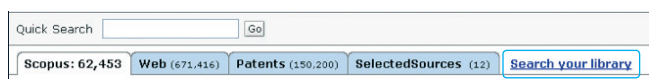
Scopus enables administrators to activate links to their library and collective catalogues. These links send search terms used in Scopus to other systems, such as an OPAC or search engine. Instead of having to re-enter search terms, researchers are guided to useful information in a seamless, efficient way.

The catalogues’ links are set up using a template URL having both a fixed and variable component. The variable component changes according to the metadata received from Scopus. The end result is a resolved link to the chosen service.

Scopus makes linking a lot simpler to understand and implement, offering a variety of flexible linking options to help administrators understand, implement and tailor linking to best suit their institute’s resources and needs. Scopus empowers administrators to set up the configuration of their institute’s linking options to ensure full access to entitlements their users need.

Activate links to your OPAC in 7 easy steps

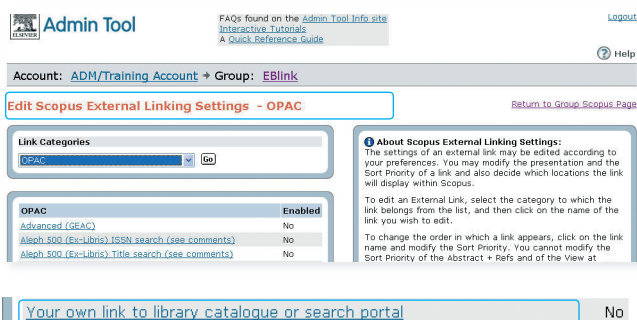
With Scopus, you can activate up to two outward links to additional services, such as your OPAC, a free Web search engine or even to another subscribed database to expose your users to other resources they might not have known about or thought of using.



These Quick Links can be displayed at both the abstract and journal level.

This link appears on the results page, next to the “Scopus,” “Web,” “Patents” and “Selected Sources” tabs as a text link.

1. Select “External Link Settings” from the Scopus tab of the Admin Tool.
2. Select “OPAC” from the Link Categories drop down box and select “Go.”
3. A list will be presented, from which the relevant OPAC option can be selected, for example, “ALEPH 500 (Ex Libris).”
4. On the following page, in the “External Link Details,” paste the Base URL of your OPAC in the “Base URL” field.
5. Select “Yes” from the “Enabled” drop down list to ensure this linking option is activated.
6. Repeat the above steps for the second resource you want to activate.
7. Once the links are activated select “Save”



If your OPAC service is not available in the dropdown menu return to the External Link Settings, select “All Link Categories,” and then, “Your own link to library catalogue” to customize a link.

Links to interlibrary loan and document delivery services

With Scopus, you can direct your users to articles that can be borrowed or delivered via interlibrary loan and document delivery services. The administrator of the library can decide to activate a link to an interlibrary loan or document delivery service in two ways:

1. As a link to the generic Scopus web form, which in turn sends a request to an e-mail address specified by the administrator; or,
2. As a link directly to a web form specified by the administrator. If linking to a service that offers an OpenURL enabled form, the fields of the form will be pre-populated.
